★ **Create Your Own Journal:** April 1st and April 3rd in Jobe Lounge (Building B) from 9am- 6pm. There will also be a drop box available for you to share your written story of how sexual assault has affected you or someone you care about.

★ **Tough Guise 2:** April 8th we will be continuously showing the movie from 9am - 4pm in the Heritage Room. The movie will be shown throughout the day with discussions following. Jackson Katz examines mass shootings, day-to-day gun violence, violence against women, bullying, gay-bashing, and American militarism against the backdrop of a culture that has normalized violent and regressive forms of masculinity in the face of challenges to traditional male power and authority.

★ **The Line:** April 15th we will be continuously showing the 24 minute movie from 9am - 4pm in the Heritage Room. The movie will be shown throughout the day with discussions following. Using a hidden camera, filmmaker Nancy Schwartzman goes head-to-head with the man who assaulted her, recording their conversation in an attempt to move through the trauma of her experience and achieve a better understanding of the sometimes ambiguous line between consent and coercion.

★ **Walking the Walk:** April 17th Room B166 9am - 4pm. This exercise is designed to allow participants to experience the issues and emotions survivors of sexual violence face each day. Participants become the survivor, and will learn about the different responses survivors receive from family, friends, and community members as they weave their way through their character’s story. This exercise leaves the participant with a better understanding of the true complexity of sexual violence and the lasting impact it has on the survivor and their loved ones.
